

From the Pastor's Desk

There has been a lot of work going on over the past few months that I would like to update you on. I think most of you in both parishes are aware that we did work in the parish hall at St Mary involving the hall floor, which led to also removing the walls. Once we got to that point we had the foundation walls re-pointed, then took care of some work on the pipes and electricity before insulating the walls and putting up new ones. I am very grateful to Deacon Wayne throughout this process, especially while I was away and kept texting with directions or asking for updates.

Meanwhile at St Theresa, we had the situation that our sprinkler system, which had passed inspection originally, could not meet standards for its ten year maintenance. It took many months, but we have replaced sprinkler heads, added valves, and brought it up to fine working order. There is some work still to be done on it to deal with a noise issue, but we can get that taken care of later. At the same time we had a switch added for the stove hood so that it can be turned on by folks who use the stove-a great improvement.

In the office we have been working to set up the online giving program and link it to our data systems and our web site. We will be mentioning this in the annual finance presentations, and will run more information in upcoming weeks bulletins. We had a test run of the system, and all seems ready for us to start using it. This service is through a company called Vanco for any who might want to get more details than we will be providing.

All these things feel like so much busy work, to be honest. However, a bright new hall is more welcoming for our activities. Knowing we and our building are safe is a great comfort. The ability for us all to support our communities in a simple, safe, and up to date manner is an important part of us practicing stewardship. These seemingly earthly activities have the potential to support our heavenly activities. May we continue to use the things of this world with gratitude to God, and with our minds and hearts set on the world to come.
